The Guide Right Program

In 1922, Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. began Guide Right, its national social out-reach program. Today, National Guide Right programs provide programming, role models, mentors, and financial assistance for youth in communities throughout the country. In order to serve young men between the ages of 5 and 25, the mission of the Guide Right Committee is to promote goals, aims, and objectives of the fraternity, in a manner that is consistent to and appropriate for our targeted audiences, to uphold the original charge of Guide Right, and to incorporate the necessary tools which will enable us to adapt to today's changing landscape and environment.

Guide Right Objectives:

1. To encourage high school and college attendance
2. Present the current and future occupation outlook
3. To assist persons of high school age, potential members and members of the undergraduate chapters to select appropriate careers to fit themselves for life in companionship with others
4. To develop leadership qualities.
5. To encourage the achievement of academic success
6. To provide youth with assistance in securing employment consistent with their qualifications.



What is Kappa League?

As one of the major programs of Guide Right, the Arlington/Grand Prairie Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. - Kappa Instructional League Program (*Kappa League*) is a developmental and enrichment program designed solely for the benefit of its participants, referred to as "*Kappa Leaguers*", by providing a structured environment of positive male role models and a multiplicity of activities for the purposes of development and leadership training.

The Kappa League Program is comprised of five core components: Academic Enhancement, Personal & Professional Development, Cultural Enrichment, Service Learning, and Social Relations.

Academic Enhancement (AE): provides support programs that complement lessons taught in the classroom and assist in further preparing for post secondary opportunities. As well, Kappa Leaguers will have hands-on opportunities to interact and engage in collegiate and corporate/business environments as a means of tying classroom lessons to real world exercises.

Personal & Professional Development (PPD): provides personal development activities, which will assist participants in making wise decisions in areas that affect their personal well being. Likewise, the professional development activities will expose participants to areas of leadership



development/training, post secondary opportunities, and skills on preparing and surviving in the corporate/business environment.

Service Learning (SL): provides projects with a focus on giving back to others and the community through community service. As a means to understanding self-worth, Kappa Leaguers must also understand the importance of helping mankind through selfless acts of volunteering time in a variety of projects.



Cultural Enrichment (CE): provides cultural programs for Kappa Leaguers to expose them to venues and activities with a focus on African American history and culture, but also exposing them to other cultures and experiences to provide a diverse appreciation in the areas of art and entertainment such as attending live theatre plays and concerts or visiting museums.

Social Relations (SR): provides social programs to serve as a means of entertainment with emphasis on balance between school, work, and extracurricular activities. This will give Kappa Leaguers a chance to interact with society in a public setting and enjoy the past time as a spectator or doing events that have direct involvement.
